Letter from the Founders

When we opened our doors a year and a half ago, we knew the story the data told: our location near I-635 and Minnesota is an area of tremendous healthcare need. Almost one in five people in our community have no medical insurance.

Now we know many of the stories behind that data. People like Marie, who was hospitalized and nearly in a coma when she couldn't afford her thyroid medicine. Since coming to Pharmacy of Grace, her condition has stabilized. Lexi needed more than \$600 worth of medications for her chronic conditions and couldn't afford them until she started coming to us. Since we opened 17 months ago, more than half (53%) of our total prescriptions filled have been for uninsured patients living in deep poverty (<100% the federal poverty level.)

Nationally, 20-30% of medications doctors prescribe are never filled, and nearly half of medications for chronic conditions aren't taken as prescribed. Pharmacy of Grace offers affordable medications and one-on-one counseling to ensure patients understand how to take them. Pharmacists see patients 12 times more than doctors, and we care deeply about closing this access and education gap in our community.

The data in this report shows we are on target in our mission of providing consistent access to prescriptions for underinsured and uninsured patients with chronic diseases. Thank you for your generosity in supporting our mission, compassion for our most vulnerable neighbors, and advancing health equity in our community.





Who We Serve


Since opening in July 2022, we have provided 9,745 total prescriptions to patients in both locations. Our patient population reflects the diversity of our community including a substantial immigrant population: 44% of our patients either don't speak English or don't speak it well. In addition to Spanish-speaking staff, we also have a translation service covering 300 languages. This allows us to connect with our patients and provide medication counseling regardless of their primary language.





Growth: RX Volume

From December 2022 to December 2023, our prescription volume has almost tripled. The increase in insured patient prescription volume shows that we are increasing revenue, which will support our long-term goal of sustainability.



Future Pharmacists

PoG is proud to play a role in training future pharmacists. We are a preceptor site for UMKC and KU pharmacy students. In 2023, we had eight students in clinical training at our pharmacy.

We also hosted students from Wyandotte High School in the KCK Public School District through a job shadowing program for youth interested in health science fields. In all, students spent 1,776 hours in our pharmacy.

Rubi's Story

Rubiselda Velazquez started coming to us in July 2022 when we first opened. She couldn't afford her insulin, so she was in and out of the hospital and couldn't work because of her poor health.

Today, she says she's feeling better, getting healthier and



gaining weight. Rubi has not been back to the hospital since being on all her meds. She can now work three days a week, is able to save up some money, and feels like she's getting her rhythm back.

When Rubi picked up her insulin and other medications recently, her bill would have been more than \$3300 dollars even with a discount plan. At Pharmacy of Grace, she paid only \$26.
